Uffculme Academy Trust - Summary of Covid-19 Safety Measures

At Uffculme Academy Trust (UAT) we take the management of risks posed by Covid-19 very seriously. All schools have undertaken detailed and thorough risk assessments in order to mitigate the risk of the virus spreading amongst pupils, staff and their families. Risk assessments for individual schools are available to parents on request via their own child's school.

This document summarises the main safety measures in place at all of our schools.

- Pupils to mix within designated class or year group bubbles only
- Schools have implemented a one way system where possible to minimse the risk of bubbles mixing
- Schools have a staggered break/lunch and/or pupils will eat food in designated areas
- Bubbles to have designated social spaces and, where possible toilets
- Classrooms and offices have been set up to enhance social distancing where this is not possible Perspex screens have been installed
- Visitors to the site will be limited and details taken for test and trace
- All children to have own equipment to minimise sharing. All shared equipment will be wiped down between uses
- Assemblies will take place virtually or in year group bubbles only
- Pupils will wear PE kit to school on days when PE is timetabled
- Key staff to be provided with visors which are also available on request for other staff
- There are enhanced cleaning routines including at the end of every lesson
- Hand sanitiser is freely available at multiple locations on site including outside the majority of classrooms
- Biometric systems have been replaced by fobs
- Pupils who travel to school via public transport will wear masks while travelling and where possible sit in year groups.
- Masks will be stored safely in pupils' bags
- Risk assessments are in place for vulnerable employees
- There is enhanced PPE for staff deemed "at risk" eg First Aiders or those providing intimate care.
- All staff have received relevant training and safer working practices updated
